

The August F. Poehler house, built in the summer of 1884 from locally produced brick and mill work and completed during the winter of 1885, is now the Sibley County Historical Museum and home to the Sibley County Historical Society.

The Historical Society was organized in 1940 with August L. Poehler of Minneapolis, former Henderson merchant, as president.


Members are admitted free of charge.

Mission Statement

The objective of the Historical Society shall be the collection, preservation and dissemination of knowledge about the history of Sibley County and to relate it to the history of the State of Minnesota.

Sibley County was established by an act of the legislature on March 5, 1853. The boundaries of the county have changed through the years. Organization of the county, with Henderson designated as county seat, was effected on January 1, 1855, by the County Commissioners in the old Valley House in Henderson.

Sibley County is located in South Central Minnesota, with fertile soil, rolling prairie, and wooded areas surrounding lakes and along the Minnesota River.

In the backyard of the museum is a log cabin built by German immigrant Christian Didra, about 1858.



This log cabin is a dramatic reminder of the harsh living conditions under which the earliest of the Sibley County pioneers existed.

There are seven cities in Sibley County:

Henderson was the first village to be incorporated (1855) and was the county seat until 1915. Winthrop was established in 1881 along with a site chosen for the railroad. Gibbon began with the arrival of the railroad and incorporated in 1882. Green Isle followed a year later with incorporation as a village in 1883. The coming of the railroad led to Arlington's incorporation in 1883. Gaylord also incorporated as a village in 1883 and became the county seat in 1915. New Auburn's incorporation followed in 1895.

There are 17 townships with settlement beginning at the County's east end in 1852.
